

## Lake Manze Selous

Situated on the banks of Lake Manze, Lake Manze Camp is an authentic tented safari camp that rests under a beautiful shady canopy of vast Doum Palms and Terminalia trees. Designed by lion researchers Manze aims to get clients in the thick of the action, this is certainly a camp that focuses on safari as opposed to opulent luxury!

Manze's communal area is simply a large thatched roof over a sand floor scattered with armchairs and sofas that make up the lounge, the dining area and the bar. Simplicity is the key - there is not even any electricity in camp, just kerosene lamps that are placed on the sand and raised up into the thatch roof.

The twelve tents are spacious and very well spread, many with good views out over the lake in front. Each tent has an en suite bathroom with flush toilet and hot shower and is furnished with twin or double beds with a comfortable veranda to watch the animals passing by.

The fact that the camp is situated on an elephant highway means that game is always around and the Lake Manze area is regarded as one of the richest areas for game in the entire Selous, both in the dry and wet season. Manze offers all the activities that the Selous can offer...walking safari, boating, game drives. However the camps cannot operate fly camping.
